Master of Ceremonies..... Mike Kronforst

Alumni: 1964- Mike Kronforst has been with Brown College for almost 34 years. He worked in Broadcasting Placement from 1978-1994, and from 1994 to the present he has been an instructor in our Broadcasting Department. In 2002 he was presented with the Rockwell Award from the Conclave for his contributions to the Conclave and to Radio.

Welcome Ron Andersen

Acting President of Brown College - Ronald G. Andersen is the acting President of Brown College and has been a Vice President and Managing Director for Career Education Corporation since November 2002. Ron joined CEC in October 1995 as President of what was then Brown Institute. During this time the College moved to Mendota Heights and started the branch campus in Brooklyn Center.

History of the College Jim Wychor

Alumni: 1953- Jim Wychor has done just about everything there is to do in the Radio Industry; from announcer to program director to engineer to sales and management. He served as President and CEO of the Minnesota Broadcaster's Association from 1989-1997, revitalizing the organization and developing the popular Alternative FCC Inspection Program. He has also served on the boards of the National Radio Broadcasters Association, the National Association of Broadcasters and is an inductee of the Pavek Museum of Broadcasting.

Alumni Perspective Roy Finden

Alumni: 1959- While a talented broadcaster in his own right, Roy Finden's greatest contribution to the industry has been as a teacher. From 1959 to 1966 he worked in various positions throughout the industry but returned to Brown Institute in 1966 as a faculty member of the Broadcasting department where he remained for 35 years. During this time he also began a career as a weathercaster and host of various other programs on KSTP and later KARE. He retired in 2001 but has left a rich legacy in the many successful students he trained to start broadcasting careers of their own. He is also an inductee of the Pavek Museum of Broadcasting.

Career Education Corporation Group President- Jake Gruver is the Group President of the Academy Division, the Colleges Division and the Gibbs Division of Career Education Corporation. He has been with Career Education Corporation in various capacities since 1999.

The History of Brown College

In 1946 Richard and Helen Brown founded the American Institute of the Air, focusing on training students for a career in the Radio industry. Nine years later in 1954 the school changed its name to Brown Institute to reflect the addition of programs in electronics, computer programming and television production.

Eventually the school outgrew its Lake Street locations, and in 1997 they left Lake Street to come to the current location in Mendota Heights. In 2001 the name of the college was changed again to Brown College to reflect another expansion of programs and the addition of the Brooklyn Center campus.

Today there are twelve degree programs, one diploma program and over 1,500 students. Brown College is now affiliated with Career Education Corporation, one of the world's fastest growing providers of private, post-secondary education.
